

(Please Read In Unison – No Walking, Entry, or Exit At This Time)

The Pharisees and some of the teachers of the law who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus 2 and saw some of his disciples eating food with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. 3 (The Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they give their hands a ceremonial washing, holding to the tradition of the elders. 4 When they come from the marketplace they do not eat unless they wash. And they observe many other traditions, such as the washing of cups, pitchers and kettles.) 5 So the Pharisees and teachers of the law asked Jesus, "Why don't your disciples live according to the tradition of the

Our 83rd Church Anniversary Preacher

Rev. Richard F. Norris II

Rev. Richard F. Norris II, the eldest son of The Late Bishop Richard & The Late Mother Mary Norris, is married to Patricia E. Wilkie Norris, the proud father of 3 children, Jasmine, Richard III & TaNia, and has 2 granddaughters, Alani and Cai. He is an alum of Gettysburg College and Payne Theological Seminary.

In 1994, Rev. Norris founded AME Youth Mass Choir in 1994, which ministered throughout the Northeast for over 7 years. Rev. Norris has also performed with the Grammy-Award Nominated Gabriel Hardeman Delegation and Changed, a contemporary male gospel group, and continues to lead "Rev. R2 & Da' Crew" — a gospel-jazz musical group born out of the music ministry of St. Matthew AME Church, Philadelphia, PA, combined with the Music ministry of Bethel-Hosanna AME Church, Pennsauken, NJ.

Prior to his pastoral career, Rev. Norris served in the music ministries at various AME Churches in the Philadelphia and Harrisburg areas including Mt. Tabor AMEC (Philadelphia), Bethel AMEC (Harrisburg), Ebenezer AMEC (Middletown), AME Union (Philadelphia), Bethel AMEC (Bryn Mawr), and Mother Bethel AMEC (Philadelphia). He also served as Minister of Music at Morris Brown AMEC (Philadelphia) and the 1st Episcopal District for over 10 years. Immediately before beginning his Pastoral Ministry, Rev. Norris served as Minister of Music at St. Matthew AME Church (Philadelphia), his home church and is currently Director of the Philadelphia AME Mass Choir.

Richard was elected and ordained an Itinerant Elder at the Bicentennial Session of the Philadelphia Annual Conference in 2016, and was appointed to his 1st Pastoral Charge, Bethel AME Church, Pennsauken, NJ in June of that same year. One year after his appointment, Rev. Norris led Bethel's merger with Hosanna AME Church in Camden, NJ. At the 146th Session of the NJ Annual Conference, Rev. Norris was appointed the 1st pastor of Bethel-Hosanna AME, Pennsauken, NJ, the newest congregation on the NJ Annual Conference, which resulted from the merging of these two historic congregations in 2017.

Richard is a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., serving as Chaplin for the "Mighty" Mu Omega Chapter in Philadelphia, PA., where he co-founded the Mu Omega Chorusand was named 2023 Mu Omega Man of the Year. He is also a member of Bethel Lodge #47. Richard is also looking forward to releasing his 4th Instrumental CD "Hymns, Anthems & Spirituals" in the near future.



YOUTH CHOIR HISTORY

The St. Matthew A.M.E. Church Youth Choir was started in 1985 by Sister Sandra Singleton-Harris and Sister DeWanna Cedarblade. The choir has grown tremendously over the years with children ranging in ages from five to eighteen (but we do welcome back all former members). The Youth Choir has been blessed with many directors and musicians who thought it not robbery to give of their time and talents. Brother Brian Patrick served as the choir's first percussionist. In the spring of 1993, Brother Russell C. Walker I became the Musical Director of the Youth Choir and remains to this day.

Brother Jonathan Ridley served diligently and faithfully as the first Director of the Youth Choir. He was succeeded by our current Director, Sister S. Princess Warren, who has served with excellence since 1995. Her singing, directing, organizational skills and talents continue to play a key role in the success of this choir. During the same year, Michael Brown Jr. continued the percussion responsibilities and remained faithfully in this role until entering college. Russell C. Walker II was appointed percussionist in 1997 at the age of 7 years old. Brother Walker II shared his musical gifts, talents, extreme dedication and commitment to the St. Matthew Youth Choir faithfully for over 16 years. Jordon Owens was appointed as our new percussionist in 2014 and served faithfully through 2015. Kevin Bowden Sr was appointed and served as percussionist 2015 through 2017. He was succeeded by Elonza (Zo) Stokes in 2017. Former Choir Members, Sisters Danielle Hunter and Shanika Peterson, took on the role of Director in 1999. Sister Hunter returned as Director in 2003. In 2004, Thaddeus Hammond joined the Youth Choir displaying a wide range of bassist skills. Along with other youth choirs, the St. Matthew Youth Choir participated in the "Back to School Youth Explosion Live Recording" at Cicely Tyson School. Two of the songs sung by the Youth Choir at the Youth Explosion were written by our very own Russell C. Walker I. S. Princess Warren returned as Directress in 2005, after being a fashion designer contestant on the Tommy Hilfiger TV reality show "The Cut." She finished runner-up in the nail-biting season-ending finale!

The Music Ministry of the Youth Choir has been a blessing in praising God's word in song and has ministered at various concerts throughout New Jersey, Delaware, Virginia and Georgia. To name a few, the Youth Choir has rendered their voices in a concert at the New Jersey State Convention of The Citizen's Action Committee in New Brunswick, N.J.; provided musical selections at the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Holiday Celebration Series at Penn Station in Newark, N.J.; represented all of New Jersey's Children's Choirs at the State of New Jersey's Observation of the Martin Luther King Jr., Holiday at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Newark, N.J.; was featured with Ben E. King at Neil's New Yorker in Mountain Lakes, N.J. for a benefit to support the United Negro College Fund; sung at the Holiday Program in Livingston Mall on several occasions; participated in the St. Paul A.M.E. Joy Night; and has traveled to Marietta, Georgia and performed in concert at Turner Chapel A.M.E. Church. The Youth Choir has traveled to Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida where they provided the Music Ministry at a local church and enjoyed all that Walt Disney World had to offer. The Youth Choir has also ministered to community-service based organizations, including patients of Kessler Institute in West Orange, N.J. and the White House Rehabilitation Center in Orange, N.J.

The Youth Choir performed as the Spotlight Opening Act during the UniverSoul Circus in Newark, NJ. Also, members of the St. Matthew Youth Choir organized, participated and raised \$500 for the "Step Out" Walk For Diabetes in Branchbrook Park. The Youth Choir has provided lively music at the Newark Liberty Airport to soothe the minds and hearts of busy travelers. Our former and current Parent Organization Leaders include Raynette Gardner, Robin McCoy, Edie Way, Rhonda Glover, Cathy Ingram, and many other parents who stepped in as needed.

The Youth Choir rehearses twice per month on Wednesdays, from 5:45pm-7pm. The choir sings for Sunday Morning 9am Worship Services on 2nd Sundays, as well as special events as requested and scheduled. We invite you to join this wonderful ministry. It is not only a ministry to God and His people, but a great opportunity to make friends, establish lifelong bonds, and have fun!

Celebrating Her 50th Anniversary as a Member of St. Matthew Gives Her Joy

From the moment she joined St. Matthew AME during the 33rd anniversary of the church's founding, Sis. Merolyn Kelly has continually been active in the church and supporting the work of the church. And today she celebrates not only her 50th anniversary as a member of St. Matthew but also the 83rd anniversary of the church. "It has all been a blessing," Sis. Kelly said. "The joy is that the church is all family to me."

At the time she joined, Sis. Kelly was raising a young family. Her mother's words telling her she needed to be a part of a church resonated in her head. And she was influenced by her cousin, Rev. Dr. James Deas, who was already a member in 1975 but not yet ordained.

Rev. Leroy Attles, who led the congregation from 1972 to 1977, was the pastor of the small but growing church. "It was very family-oriented," Sis. Kelly said of the church which was still in the original building at that time. "I was part of the hospitality group. We served tea and coffee after church on one Sunday each month."

And she enrolled her children, Derek and Nicole, in Sunday school. They also participated in the youth choir which was started under Rev. Attles. she said.

And after the shepherd's role was turned over to then Rev. Reginald T. Jackson, now Bishop Jackson, she continued her work and activism in the church. Under his leadership, the Inspirational choir was created. "One Sunday, Rev. Jackson asked everyone aged 15 to 30 to stand and he told them they were now all members of the choir." She didn't think she should have been in it because she felt she couldn't sing but she learned.

Sis. Kelly became involved with the Young People's Division and even drove the church van. Rev. Jackson appointed her YPD director and she stayed in that role for about six years "even after her daughter left for college," she said. "I was making sure they were participating. I could see how they grew and made friendships," she said. Sis. Kelly then became a trustee for about eight years. "And we started the Commission on African American History and Culture. And we named it after Rev. John Wesley Jackson after he passed away. He was a former assistant pastor.

Because she worked in education, she was also involved with the summer camp program and eventually became its director. "Because of summer camp, I did get to meet other members in the church. "We had a field trip every Friday. And the older teens became the aides."

Sis. Kelly also taught Sunday School for about 10 years. "I learned so much preparing lessons," Sis. Kelly said. "Just working in the church and being active is what helps you connect with other church members." Her involvement in the church didn't stop when Rev. Melvin Wilson became pastor of the church. She continues her missionary work and staying active with other committees.

I am at home when I come to St. Matthew," she said. "It is an awesome feeling." Sis. Kelly noted. "Your commitment and involvement will help you grow. And young people can be a mentor to you, especially working with the YPD." Sis. Kelly said she owes part of her success outside of the church to Bro. Michael Brown, who pointed her in the direction of financial aid when she was in college and then also told her about the availability of money for graduate school. She retired as a school counselor from the East Orange school district about 10 years ago. She is also the chair of the John Wesley Jackson Commission on Black History and Culture that each third Sunday of month presents a Black History Moment.

Her joy in celebrating her 50th anniversary comes from being a part of the St. Matthew family. "I am still active in the church and I have support from current members. God has spared me. I am still a missionary," she said. "I've watched the young people grow up and become adults and now they are leading me in the organizations," she added. "There's never been a point in my life where I felt displaced. St. Matthew is home."


