

Matthew 2:1-12 NIV

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem ² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³ When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: ⁶ 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.'" ⁷ Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him." ⁹ After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the

star, they were overjoyed. **11** On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. **12** And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

She Uses Her Gifts from God to Grow and Learn

Learning about God and different people in the Bible excite Aoki Mae each week she attends Sunday school classes at St. Matthew AME. Aoki (pronounced i-oki) also likes the snacks and playing Cahoots following the Sunday school lesson, a game at which she is very good. "I may get a couple wrong," she said. "I like to get the gift cards," she said of winning.

Aoki has been a member of St. Matthew AME since she was 6 months old. She attends church and Sunday School each week with her grandmother, Delores Mae, a Sunday school teacher and former Sunday school superintendent. Aoki, who lives in Irvington, N.J. with her dad Jonathan Mae and mom Leslie Brown, spends her weekends with grandmother and attends church with her.

The 10-year-old is a competitive 5th grader at Kipp Justice Academy in Newark who has a 3.45 average. She enjoys physical education and art as well as science and math classes. She is also a member of the art club and the book club and Aoki has tried out for the basketball team and for cheerleading. Her busy life does not stop with church and school. She is also active in "Love You Girl Foundation," a South Orange agency that fights domestic violence.

She also likes participating in plays produced by the Sunday school department, including the December 21 production of "Now I See." Aoki learned her lines weeks ahead of time so she would be ready for her performance. And she really liked the recent fundraiser auction where she and her grandmother won the bid for a Donovan McNabb jersey for her dad who is an avid Eagles fan. "We had fun going back and forth," she said.

Her favorite saying is "To God be the Glory." Everyday is about God, Grandmother Mae said she has taught Aoki. "We should always glorify his name." Aoki has also done the welcome to visitors, the prayer, and the call to worship during youth Sundays at the church. And she is involved in youth activities in the church as well.

She has also created three small businesses, making and selling bracelets with her best friend and selling snacks to friends after school. And sometimes she does nails, too.

Grandmother Mae said she also sings and has taken piano lessons. "We talk about using the gifts God has given you," she said. One of Aoki's favorite activities is doing arts and crafts in the kitchen with her grandmother. "She has a special spot here on the kitchen counter, Grandmother Mae said. And both grandmother and granddaughter like to travel. Their month-long summer trip to Maryland, Virginia and South Carolina during the summer months includes visiting her cousins and her uncle, Nathaniel Jr. and Grandmother Mae's oldest son. "We have a good time," both said.

Grandmother Mae joined St. Matthew in 1991 and became a Sunday school teacher, eventually becoming superintendent. "I have been with the Sunday school for 33 years and I love it," she said. "And I wanted Aoki to be a part of the church so I started bringing her."

Aoki said she would eventually like to become a veterinarian or seamstress. She has a dog named Deuce Blue Mae, "a friendly boxer who is 4 years old in human years.

Her Healing Comes From God

The necklace 14-year-old Gabrielle Pearson wears references John 15:13, a Bible verse that guides her life and honors her late father.

"Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends," reads the verse. It was given to her when her father Senior Corrections Officer Al-Mustafa Pearson, who was killed in the line of duty in 2020, was honored for the first time.

"My life has a crack that cannot be filled with concrete or sewn back together," Gabrielle said. "The only person who can help me heal is God above."

Gabrielle is a ninth grader and an honor student with a 3.85 GPA at Union Catholic High School in Scotch Plains where she enjoys her Italian class and performing in theater productions.

She also enjoys writing and drawing, she said. "I like fantasy stories."

"I've been a part of St. Matthew since I was in my mother's womb," she said. "I've always loved singing," she said. My mom has videos of me. It is great to be able to sing for the glory of God. She regularly attends Sunday School at St. Matthew.

Gabrielle and her mother, Elaine Pearson, are also active in the Concerns of Police Survivors (COPS), an organization that supports families of fallen officers. And Mrs. Pearson is a retired police officer. Because of COPS, Gabrielle said she has been able to connect with "other kids from other states. I've met people from Georgia, California and I am in group chats. We sometimes text each other or call."

"She is able to connect with other children dealing with some type of death," Mrs. Pearson said. She has also participated in the Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) activities, Toys for Tots, the Student Movement Against Cancer and made cards for hospitalized kids.

Gabrielle said she hopes to attend college and eventually pursue a career in law. "There's a lot of crazy things going on the world," she said. "I would like to fight for others, especially those who don't have a voice."

Crockpot Balsamic Chicken

Ingredients

6-8 boneless chicken thighs
1 white onion chopped
2. cans of stewed tomatoes (low sodium if possible)
4 cloves of garlic
1/2 cup balsamic vinegar

Preparation:

1. Add some olive oil to the bottom of the crock pot.
2. Place the chicken thighs, tomatoes, onion, seasonings, garlic and balsamic vinegar in the crock pot.
3. Cover and cook on high for 4 hours
4. Top with fresh Kale when you have 30 minutes left.
5. Serve over quinoa or brown rice.
