



III. Introduction to the Book of Revelation (Oh oh!)

A. The more complete name: **The Revelation of Jesus Christ to John**



- 1. Which John? John Mark, John the Baptist, or John the Apostle?
- 2. The only one of Jesus' original 12 disciples who was not killed for the faith.
- 3. Author of the Gospel of John, 1st, 2nd, & 3rd John, and Revelation
- B. The key (for me) to understanding the Book of Revelation

Revelation 1:1-3 NIV

The revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, ² who testifies to everything he saw—that is, the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. ³ Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are

those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.

- C. Revelation is "apocalyptic" (hidden)
- D. The book concerns the future; the end of the world, the second coming of Christ
 - 1. Armageddon, the ultimate fight between good and evil

Revelation 16:12-16 NIV

¹² The sixth angel poured out his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up to prepare the way for the kings from the East. ¹³ Then I saw three impure spirits that looked like frogs; they came out of the mouth of the dragon, out of the mouth of the beast and out of the mouth of the false prophet. ¹⁴ They are demonic spirits that perform signs, and they go out to the kings of the whole world, to gather them for the battle on the great day of God Almighty. ¹⁵ "Look, I come like a thief! Blessed is the one who stays awake and remains clothed, so as not to go naked and be shamefully exposed." ¹⁶ Then they gathered the kings together to the place that in Hebrew is called Armageddon (Mount Megiddo).

- E. Revelation has many symbols, numbers that must be interpreted (biblical hermeneutic)
- F. Why is Revelation so confusing? Possible Interpretive Approaches:
 - 1. **Preterist View** Most or all prophecies alluded to in the Book of Revelation have been fulfilled in the past.
 - 2. **Futurist View** Except for the first three chapters, John is describing events that have not yet happened and will occur in the future.
 - 3. **Historicist View** Reading the book of Revelation as a chronological fulfillment of events throughout church history from John's day until the second coming of Christ and beyond.
 - 4. **Idealist View** The book of Revelation is a symbolic representation of the continual struggle of good and evil. It does not refer to any particular historical events. It is applicable to any point in history.
 - 5. **Amillennial** A Christian eschatological belief that the millennium, or 1,000-year reign of Christ, is symbolic and refers to the current church age, not a future earthly kingdom.
 - 6. **Historical Premillennial** Viewpoint that there will be a period of tribulation, then Christ will reign on earth for a literal 1,000 years following His second coming. The saints will be resurrected at the beginning of the millennium, non-believers at the end, followed by judgment.
 - 7. **Dispensational Premillennial** A theological perspective that believes Christ will return before a literal 1,000-year reign on Earth, following a two-phase return that includes a secret "rapture" before a seven-year tribulation period. It is the viewpoint that after the battle of Armageddon, Christ will rule through the Jews for a literal 1,000

- years, accompanied by two resurrections and at least three judgments.
- 8. **Postmillennialism** A theological view that believes Christ's second coming will occur after a future, extended "millennium" of Christian influence and prosperity on Earth.
- G. The Context of Revelation
 - 1. John was exiled to Patmos because he refused to stop preaching the Word of God.

Revelation 1:9-11 NIV

- ⁹ I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. ¹⁰ On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet, ¹¹ which said: "Write on a scroll what you see and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea."
 - 2. 1:12 7 lampstands = 7 churches
 - 3. 1:14-15 Proof that Jesus was black?

Revelation 1:12-16 NIV

¹² I turned around to see the voice that was speaking to me. And when I turned I saw seven golden lampstands, ¹³ and among the lampstands was someone like a son of man, dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest. ¹⁴ The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire. ¹⁵ His feet were like bronze glowing in a furnace, and his voice was like the sound of rushing waters. ¹⁶ In his right hand he held seven stars, and coming out of his mouth was a sharp, double-edged sword. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance.

- H. Structure of the 7 Letters to the 7 Churches
 - 1. Christological Focus
 - 2. Commendation, except Laodicea
 - 3. Condemnation, except Smyrna, Philadelphia
 - 4. Concentration/Instruction
- I. Additional Information:
 - 1. The name of the Lord Jesus Christ appears only eight (8) times in this book.
 - 2. Specific references to the "Holy Spirit" are limited. The word "spirit" is used sporadically, but at no place does the full New Testament term "Holy Spirit" appear.

IV. Analysis of the First Letter to the Church at Ephesus - 2:1-7


Revelation 2:1-7 NIV

"To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of him


who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands. ² I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance. I know that you cannot tolerate wicked people, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. ³ You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary. ⁴ Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first. ⁵ Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place. ⁶ But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. ⁷ Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.

- A. **Christological Focus** 2:1 Christ walks among all churches
 - 1. We are thankful that Christ walks among us at St. Matthew, but we are not the only church where Christ walks.
 - a. Deliverance from spiritual jealousy, envy, separatism
 - b. Two things can be true. We can celebrate what God is doing among us AND celebrate what God is doing in other churches!
- B. **Commendation** 2:2 hard work, perseverance, intolerance of wickedness, examination of apostles, endured hardships for the name of Christ, hate practices of the Nicolaitans
 - 1. The value of hard work and perseverance
 - 2. What does it mean not to tolerate wickedness?
 - 3. The importance of examining apostles (those who are "sent")
 - 4. When the church "takes a hit" for Christ.
 - 5. The Nicolaitans believers who had compromised their faith in order to enjoy some of the sinful practices of Ephesian society
 - a. Where have we compromised?
- C. **Condemnation** 2:4 forsaken first love (lost zeal, busy but not for God)
- D. **Concentration** 2:5b "Repent and do the things you did at first."
 - 1. What will happen if we don't? The negative consequence.
 - a. Removal of lampstand
 - 2. What will happen if we do? The positive consequence.
 - a. Eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God


